Editorial Mission and Policies

ANSU Journal of Arts and Social Sciences (ANSUJASS) is published by the Faculty of Social Sciences, Chukwuemeka Odumegwu Ojukwu University (formerly Anambra State University), Igbariam Campus. The journal is geared to disseminating research outputs of academics in Nigeria, Africa and the rest of the world. The peer-reviewed, multidisciplinary journal aims at promoting scholarship in all areas in Arts and Social Sciences.

ANSUJASS hereby invite researchers to submit for publication, their high quality original manuscripts to the journal's Editorial secretary at ansujass@coou.edu.ng. The journal welcomes sound theoretical and empirical papers, discursive articles, position papers and short book reviews.

Manuscripts which must be submitted in Microsoft-word format should not exceed 20 pages (including abstract, references, tables, figures and appendices). The abstract which should not exceed 150 words must be followed by five key words and JEL classification codes. Manuscripts must be formatted with Times New Roman, font size 12 and double line spacing on A4 size paper. Spellings must be in UK English. For citations and referencing, ANSUJASS adopts both the 6th edition of the American Psychological Association (APA) and Modern Language Association (MLA) formats.

The authors' names, institutional affiliations and their full addresses (including E-mails and Phone numbers) should appear only on the title page separated from the manuscript to ensure anonymity in the review process. The title of the paper should however appear on all the pages of the manuscript. For papers with more than one author, the name of the corresponding author (with E-mail address and phone number) should be indicated.

Contributors should ensure that their manuscripts are original and not under consideration for publication in any other research outlet. An editorial decision (either before or after blind peer review) on the manuscripts will be taken quickly and communicated to contributors. The assessment fee per article is \$\frac{15}{5},000\$ only, payable to **JOURNAL OF ARTS AND SOCIAL SCIENCES** (1153000104) of ECO BANK PLC on submission of the manuscript. An author of any accepted paper will be required to pay additional \$\frac{1}{5},000\$ for publication of the paper, also in the same account. After each payment, the scanned copy of evidence of payment should be forwarded to ansujass@coou.edu.ng.

The journal is published every March and September and manuscripts are welcomed throughout the year. The journal website is under maintenance. Hence,

all manuscripts should be sent electronically as E-mail attachment to the Editorial Secretary at ansujass@coou.edu.ng.
